ORDINANCE NO. 09-09

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RICH TOWNSHIP CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS**

WHEREAS, the Illinois Township Code, 60 ILCS 1/1-1 et seq., regulates construction contracts entered into by Rich Township; and

WHEREAS, Section 205-105 of the Township Code, 60 ILCS 1/205-105, allows Rich Township to determine what constitutes a responsible bidder for construction projects that exceed \$20,000; and

WHEREAS, the Supervisor and Board of Trustees specifically find that the definition of a lowest responsible bidder needs to be expanded in the case of bidders for construction projects in excess of \$20,000.00 pursuant to Section 205-105 of the Township Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Supervisor and Board of Trustees of Rich Township, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. Recitals Incorporated. The recitals set forth above constitute a material part of this Ordinance as if set forth in their entirety in this Section 1.

Section 2. Responsible Bidder for Construction Projects that Exceed \$20,000.

Subject to the requirements of Section 205-105 of the Township Code, 60 ILCS 1/205-105, as amended, a responsible bidder for construction contracts that exceed \$20,000 means a bidder who meets all of the following requirements, and shall submit evidence of meeting such requirements:

- (1) Compliance with all applicable laws prerequisite to doing business in Illinois.
- (2) Evidence of compliance with:
 - a. Federal Employer Tax Identification Number or Social Security Number (for individual); and
 - b. Provisions of Section 2000(e) of Chapter 21, Title 42 of the United States Code and Federal Executive Order No. 11246, as amended by Executive Order No. 11375 (known as the Equal Opportunity Employer provisions).

(3) Certificates of insurance indicating the following coverages: general liability, workers compensation, completed operations, automobile, hazardous occupation, product liability and professional liability, as applicable.

(4) Compliance with all provisions of the Prevailing Wage Act, 820 ILCS 130/0.01 *et seq.*, as amended, including wages, medical and hospitalization insurance and retirement for those trades as covered in the Act.

(5) Participation in apprenticeship and training programs approved and registered with the United States Department of Labor's Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training.


Section 3. Severability and Repeal of Inconsistent Ordinances. If any provision of this Ordinance, or the application of any provision of this Ordinance, is held unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such occurrence shall not affect other provisions of this Ordinance, or their application, that can be given effect without the unconstitutional or invalid provision or its application. Each unconstitutional or invalid provision, or application of such provision, is severable, unless otherwise provided by this Ordinance. All ordinances, resolutions or orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately after its passage, approval and publication as required by law.
